Required Longitudinal Experiences (year-long)

- -Academia Longitudinal (meets quarterly and as needed for teaching activities)
- -Ambulatory Care Outpatient Family Medicine Longitudinal (in clinic every other Thursday)
- -Clinical Drug Policy (project-based)
- -Hospital Pharmacy Practice (staffing two 8 hour shifts every third weekend & selected holidays includes 8 hour ACLS response once per 1-2 weeks)
- -Teaching Certificate Program (if not completed as a PGY1 resident)
- -Research and Manuscript (project-based)
- *Full month of Orientation not required if resident is a previous PGY1 resident at UTMC. In this case, a required learning experience will be substituted.
